HOMESCHOOLING

Fifty girls in all levels switched to virtual learning and homeschooling during lockdown. Keeping up with the girls' educational needs made hiring another teacher vital.



WORSHIP

We worshiped together at home by joining virtual church services, continuing family Bible study, and with worship music and prayer.

GIRLS LIVING IN ALPAS HOME

Josie signed papers for legal guardianship of 4 new girls.

The CtL Board approved a second home, making room for more girls needing rescue and recovery.

Lockdowns altered normal daily life, but the uninterrupted time together led to a focus on building supportive, serving, and loving relationships.

The girls played, worshipped, and schooled in the home. Adding a new teacher was important to facilitate virtual learning for the number of students. For 17 months, outings consisted of runs and hikes around the neighborhood.

2020

Staff were unable to come to the home during strict lockdown periods, so cooking duties were assigned by age group. Every girl had a part in making the family meals. Meals cooked, new things tried? Health building prevention & remedies?

We sustained our efforts in seeking justice. Court appearances, too, were virtual and done in the safety of our home.



Shaira's is a story of courage and redemption. When she was 4, her parents separated and sent her to live with her grandparents. By the age of 11, she had experienced sexual abuse from three different men. She returned to live with her mother, but was soon being sexually abused by her mother's boyfriend. Even though he threatened to kill her if she told anyone, Shaira was courageous enough to open up to her mother about the truth of the abuse.

That same week, she met Josie, CtL's founder, and began attending her Bible studies. The first Consider the Lily home opened in 2011 and welcomed Shaira to the original family of 24 girls. She recognizes this as the beginning of her path toward redemption. By the end of 2011, with the help of a CtL social worker, she was able to file a case against her stepfather, starting a 5 year and 3 month long process that finally ended in a life-sentence verdict for him. Knowing that this man could not hurt her 3 half sisters who still lived at home with her mom was a huge relief.

After graduating from high school in 2016, she was able to attend a YWAM program in Australia where the Lord completely healed her of her past bitterness, pain, and bad memories. She is now in college, studying to be a pediatrician, and knows with confidence that she is a daughter of the King of Kings who calls her His friend.


